Meeting Minutes of the Parks and Recreation Committee
Tuesday, February 2, 2016

Chairman Todd Gaines called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, February 2, 2016. Parks and Recreation Committee members in attendance included Chairman Todd Gaines, and Trustee Pete Garrity. Recreation and Sports Complex staff included Director of Recreation and Sports Complex Connie Kowal and Recreation Manager Julie Ludwig. Also in attendance included Mayor Terry Wepler, Trustee Scott Adams, Village Administrator Kevin Bowens, Village Engineer Fred Chung, and Superintendent of Parks, Forestry and Grounds Jim Barlow. Absent from the meeting was Trustee Rich Moras.

1) Minutes of the Parks and Recreation Committee

Chairman Todd Gaines motioned to approve the Tuesday, January 5, 2016 meeting minutes. Trustee Pete Garrity seconded. Minutes approved.

2) Sports Organizations Presentations

Libertyville Youth Baseball -Bill Bennett reported on behalf of Pete Land. Youth Baseball program is for eight to fourteen year olds, there is a full time travel league for seventh and eighth graders with paid coaches. Younger grades have all volunteer coaches.

Libertyville Little League Baseball - Bill Bennett reported. Little League will begin their 65th year on 2016. They are a totally inclusive program for ages four – eighteen years old and scholarships are available for players. Opening Day is Saturday, April 16, 2016.

Libertyville Boys Club - Kevin Scott reported. Registration for 2015 was up 7% from 2014.

All participants must go through concussion test at Libertyville High School before they can step on the field. New helmets were purchased and upgraded existing helmets. There was at least one game played at Libertyville High School Football Field.

Libertyville Girls Softball Association - Mike Pezzella reported. There were 260 participants in House league for 2015. Improved uniforms to female cut this season and had a great response from the girls. Girls Softball will be hosting Memorial Day Tournament this year and will continue normal maintenance to the Nicholas Dowden Fields.

Greater Libertyville Soccer Association (GLSA) - Michael Zovistoski reported. Three programs Recreation ages 4-16, Premier no cut policy ages U8 – High School and Select are the top teams from the U11 to U18 ages. They hold a coaches clinic for volunteer coaches semi-annually. They are a major user of the Libertyville Sports Complex for indoor training and winter league play. Village Parks are used for practices during the spring and fall months.

3) Bolander Hockey Rink Update

Discussion continued with moving the Hockey Rink to Adler Memorial Park with a preferred sight layout. Trustee Gaines said the staff was looking for direction on site at Adler Memorial Park. Staff will proceed with a letter to the Carriage Hill neighborhood informing them of the potential site of the hockey rink and inviting them to the April 5th meeting. Staff will gather facts, soil testing and time tables.

4) Summer Day Camp Report

Recreation Manager Julie Ludwig reported on the successful 2015 Adler Day Camp Program. This past summer 2,346 campers enjoyed 10 weeks of summer fun, outdoor games and sports, arts & crafts, field trips and visits to Adler Pool to cool off. In 2015 there were 374 families served, up from 2014 with 272 families. Weekly Newsletters, emails, and website updates helped with parent communications. Mark Stave, Camp Director and Jen Gibori, Assistant Director are coming back for Adler Day Camp 2016. Staff hiring will begin at the end of February through mid-March.

5) Libertyville Senior Center

Members of the Libertyville Senior Council, Norma Kick and Joyce Quilty submitted a proposal asking for additional staffing at the Libertyville Senior Center. Norma Kick attended the meeting to discuss options for additional staffing. Mrs. Kick asked for the Trustees to consider adding two additional part-time staff to help with day to day activities, daily paperwork and additional programming. Trustee Gaines suggested a volunteer campaign in the Village Views and on website to see if the gap can be filled with volunteers first. Trustee Garrity added that there would need to be plan put together with cost analyst, and possibly looking at grants or a blended approach. Trustee Adams liked the idea of a volunteer recruitment. The Parks and Recreation Committee asked that the Senior Council put together a plan and come back to the April meeting and discuss proposal.

6) Other Updates/Follow-up

A) Libertyville Golf Course Update

Court proceedings at Lake County Circuit Court with BCS Golf, scheduled for January 6, 2016, were postponed and rescheduled for February 25, 2016.

B) Eagle Scout Project Presentation Update

No progress.

C) EAB

Reviewed updated tree removal stats.

D) Libertyville Recreation & Sports Complex Events Schedule

The Events Schedule attached listed the activities, events and programs that took place in January and February.

E) Marketing & Publicity

Director Kowal attached several newspaper articles of programs and events that took place at the Libertyville Sports Complex and other Recreation facilities.

Subject: Hockey Rink Relocation Update

At the February 2, 2016 Committee meeting, Staff was directed to focus their efforts on the relocation of the Bolander Hockey Rink to Adler Park and the 'northwest' location. Staff met on several occasions to review the necessary steps, timetables, costs and regulatory agencies approvals.

Similar to the details of the Butler Lake proposed location, Staff has contacted a soil testing company (Rubino Inc.) as to their services to test the grounds at the Adler Park location. Jorgensen Associates has been contacted to perform the topographical site survey that is needed. Also, Gewalt Hamilton Associates engineering firm has been contacted and they are positioned to perform the necessary preliminary site design plans, as well as assist the Village in working with the regulatory agencies pertaining to Floodway and Floodplain topics. Gewalt Hamilton can also assist the Village in the development of the bid package once plans are developed for the Village to take the hockey rink construction plans to bid. A tentative layout of the Adler Park hockey rink location has allowed our Parks Division to determine the trees that might be affected in this area. Engineering Staff is researching the utility lines for water and electric to prepare for these services at the site location. Existing storage space at Adler Park can be utilized for the storage of the equipment needed to maintain the ice rink during the winter. Codes for the height of light poles is 25' therefore the 40' poles from the Bolander rink will either need to be shortened to comply with code, seek a variance, or factor 25' poles in the construction bid. Additionally, due to our Recreation Summer programs at Adler Park such as Summer Day Camp and the operation of Adler Swimming Pool, it is recommended by Staff to commence any construction for this project after Labor Day. Staff will also communicate with renters of Adler Lodge, Adler Pavilions and rental of Adler Park for special events as to the adjustments needed during construction. Staff has also explored the cost advantages of starting construction in the fall or in the spring.

It was deemed important to invite the neighbors located south of Adler Park to the April Committee meeting to share information with them on this topic.

Attached is a letter that was sent to the President of the Carriage Hill Homeowners Association inviting him to the April meeting and to invite others in the neighborhood to attend as well.

The Village of Libertyville recently sold the Bolander Park property at 625 West Winchester Road and moved the Recreation Department administrative offices and staff to the Sports Complex. The Bolander Park property also included an outdoor hockey rink which was dismantled and will be relocated. The Village Trustees who comprise the Parks and Recreation Committee, along with Village Staff, have discussed the feasibility of relocating the hockey rink to a location at Adler Park, adjacent to the Adler Lodge.

This topic will be discussed further at the next Committee meeting on Tuesday April 5, 2016 at 6pm at Village Hall, 118 West Cook Avenue. The Trustees of the Committee welcome you to attend this meeting to share information with you and to seek your input. SUBJECT: Buy-a-Brick Program for Cook Park

In 1998-1999 the Village undertook a major renovation to Cook Park, which included the installation of brick pavers along various sections of Cook Park sidewalk. The Village offered a "Buy a Brick" program for residents and businesses to purchase a 4" x 8" brick and have it installed in the Park. Last year the Village included funding in the Park Improvement Fund to again offer residents an opportunity to "Buy a Brick" in Cook Park, however we were unable to start the project. Funding has been carried over in the 2016-17 Village Budget, and Staff is recommending that the Parks and Recreation Committee recommend to the Village Board that we institute a "Buy a Brick" Program.

Staff recommends that the Village publicize the program and administer the order forms, contract with "Impressions in Stone" of Indian Creek, Illinois to do the actual engraving, (the company did the engraving in 1998-99), and contract with a landscaping company to remove and re-install the paver bricks. It is anticipated that we will be able to utilize most of the existing blank bricks in Cook Park; however there may be the need to purchase additional replacement bricks. Staff also anticipates that given the locations of the 4" x 8" bricks to be engraved, sections can be blocked off and the pavers removed and replaced without any significant disruption to activities in the Park.

If the Committee agrees with reinstating a "Buy-a-Brick" program for Cook Park, Staff will work on finalizing the pricing for the engraving of the bricks, as well as the removal and reinstallation. The cost of an engraved brick during the initial 1998-99 program was \$60-\$75, and staff from Impressions in Stone indicates that typical prices for this type of program are in a \$75-\$150 range. Staff would make sure that the price of the engraved brick covers all Village costs, as well as generate some additional revenue for the Libertyville Foundation (as we previously discussed) and/or any other cause the Mayor and Village Board may choose.



Parkway Ash Tree Reduction Plan








Libertyville's hockey rink plans move forward

Libertyville village staff has deemed Adler Park a "feasible" site for the hockey rink that had been at Bolander Park, but a final decision appears at least two months away as evaluations continue.

At the Feb. 2 Parks and Recreation Committee meeting, staff members reviewed initial findings on whether the northwest field of Adler Park would be a suitable location for the hockey rink that is in need of a new location since the village's recent sale of Bolander Park.

The focus is now placed on Adler Park and after some initial review, the staff believes the site "feasible," according to a village memo.

At the same time, staff said many areas still have to be explored regarding whether Adler can be the location of the rink, that would be used for ice skating in the winter and roller blading in the warmer months. That includes soil testing and site survey work to be conducted by engineers, getting feedback from neighbors south of the park and coordinating current recreation programming at the park, including summer lay camp and the rental of Adler Park lodge, ancillary park facilities and the swimming pool on the location.

"We have some action out there, so we may have to look at some suggested times of operation to make it non-disruptive to the business that takes place out there," noted Connie Kowal, Libertyville's director of parks and recreation.

What village staff has learned in the early going is there is enough storage area so that additional buildings will not have to be constructed and utilities appear to be accessible, according to the staff memo.

Moreover, Parks Superintendent Jim Mulrow did not fear a loss of healthy trees to make way for the rink, based on conversations with arborists.

With an OK from the Parks Committee it came at the Feb. 2 meeting, village staff

"Before we can make a recommendation to the village board, we are still in that exploratory process right now," said chairman Todd Gaines. "We remain committed to the hockey people in terms of putting this hockey rink in."

Senior Center funding

Representatives of the Libertyville's Senior Center — located inside the village's civic center — are requesting the village appropriate additional funding for the operations of center.

After a meeting in December, volunteers asked the village to come up with funding that would pay for two part-time staffers throughout the week. Currently, the senior center director is the only salaried employee which is a part-time role.

"Our neighboring centers have between one and three full-time and between one and six part-time employees," noted resident and frequent senior center patron Joyce Quilty in a letter sent to Mayor Terry Weppler and the Parks Committee. "We have as many if not more activities as they have and we're doing it with one staff person! I think the director and the seniors deserve better."

THE INSIDE TRACK

Area golfers looking to improve their swings during the winter months have plenty of options

In the Chicago area, golf is often considered a spring and summer sport.

But frigid temperatures — like those recorded in Lake County in recent weeks — don't have to stop avid golfers from practicing. There are businesses all over the area that cater to golfers seeking to improve their swings before the weather warms up.


GolfTEC is just one such business. With nine locations in Chicago — including in Vernon Hills and Deerfield — GolfTEC bills itself as a national leader in private golf instruction, with more than 5 million lessons given.

Kurt Kollmeyer, the regional manager for locations in Deerfield, Vernon Hills, Schaumburg and Des Plaines, said GolfTEC relies on blending technology with private instruction.

"I think our technology speaks for itself, but the real difference is in our coaches and the training that we do and continuing things we try to get them better at every day," Kollmeyer said. "The technology is a big part of it as well, just being able to have ball flight, motion analysis and video all in one, and to be able to take it outside."

Ryan Colberg, the center manager and a director of instruction at GolfTEC's Schaumburg location, said golf is becoming a year-round sport. In fact, he says the stretch from January to June is the busiest time of the season at most GolfTEC locations.

"Summer is when golf is still going. That's our busiest. But between now and until June is our busiest, especially for the serious golfers," Colberg said. "They will work on their game and swing now to ... make changes now so in the spring they will be ready to play."

Kollmeyer said most GolfTEC locations feature three hitting bays, each equipped with at least two video cameras — one behind the golfer and one to the side. There's a screen located to the right of the golfer, on the floor, that allows the player to look at each camera angle.

The player wears a harness that is equipped with sensors on the hip and shoulder to monitor key points of a swing. Those can be used as reference points when comparing swings. Colberg said GolfTEC's sys-

tem allows golfers to compare their average swing positions with those of 150 PGA Tour players.

The resulting videos give players a tool to reference even after they leave the practice facility.

"People can spend hours on the range outside and think they are doing it correctly and never come in or they can come here and hit balls in front of the video where every swing is taken and recorded and they can confirm if they are doing things correctly or poorly and make the changes,"

Colbert said. "The video will help them see visually what they are doing, learn the swing faster as a result."

Of course, GolfTEC is far from the only indoor golf option for area players. Here are a few other places where you can get your game in shape before spring arrives:

Golf Zone

Where: 80 Oak Creek Plaza, Mundelein

Features: Golf Zone has six individual golf simulators, each of which offers 60

different golf courses (including courses in Japan, Korea and China). The facility features state-of-the-art launch monitors that calculate real driving range distances.

Features: This indoor facility features 32 hitting

stations, a putting green and a separate chipping green with two sand bunkers to serve the needs of the avid golfer during the winter. The facility also has a full-service pro shop that offers clubs, club repair and instructors available for private or group lessons.

Features: The Golf Practice has ample space, with a new 7,000-square-foot indoor training and practice center that provides golfers with a facility that replicates an on-course environment. The indoor facility includes chipping and pitching areas, a bunker with Augusta sand, a high-speed camera system for video analysis and a clubhouse lounge.

Highland Park Fieldhouse

Where: 2205 Skokie Valley Road, Highland Park

Features: This multi-sport indoor facility offers a temperature-controlled driving range without the hassles of having too many golfers or distractions. Custom fitting for golf clubs is also offered on select dates.

Libertyville Sports Complex

Where: 1950 N. Highway 45, Libertyville

Features: Forty weather-protected stations with heaters and automated tees allow golfers to work on their game in a more natural outdoor setting during the winter months. Other features include a full-flight driving range with lights and matted or grass tees with a chipping and putting green.

Libertyville to decide future of golf course

Flood-prone 9-hole course won't open for second straight year

As golf season approaches, leagues are forming, season passes are sold and specials are advertised, but the future of the 9-hole Libertyville Golf Course at Riverside Park is in flux.

Legal action continues to affect the flood-prone course along the Des Plaines River, and it won't open for the second straight year, according to Mayor Terry Wepler.

"We're going to maintain it and get through our budget and decide exactly where we're going to go from here," Wepler said.

That's the case because a long-term lease with a private company didn't pan out. The tenancy has been terminated, and the village has regained possession of the property. Whether that means seeking a new tenant, working with the

former one or resuming operations is to be determined.

"At this point, they can pursue any path they want to with their property," Village Attorney David Pardys said.

However, a new budget year begins May 1, and it's unlikely officials would want to sink money into the course. The village had operated and maintained the course since 1978, but it lost an average \$83,500 a year.

"We never made money, ever, since the village has owned it," said Connie Kowal, head of the parks department and Sports Complex. "That was part of the mix of things."

Officials decided to cut their losses and lease the course to a private operator. In early 2013, an agreement was struck with BCS Golf Group LLC represented by Blair Subry.

Besides adding a short-game academy and teaching center, BCS planned to replace the


greens and tees with synthetic turf that could be vacuumed dry to allow for play during wet periods.

"It was a really good way to have the course enhanced," Kowal said of the original plans.

Daily fee golf was offered in 2013 and 2014, but the course did not open in 2015. Early last June, Subry said he was meeting with partners and still hoped to install the synthetic turf, a golf practice center and foot golf course — an investment estimated at \$1.3 million.

But no work was done. The village hired a contractor to cut the grass, but the greens and sand traps became overgrown.

Last July, the village sued BCS for breach of contract. A judgment of \$44,807 plus costs — which has not been paid — was rendered last September and an agreed order entered in January. The parties were in

court Thursday to determine whether there are available assets to satisfy the judgment, Pardys said.

The operation known as Studio 59 at the Libertyville golf course appears in a web search, but it is listed as closed and the phone number rings without an answer. A number listed for BCS in Long Grove says the voice message box is full.

The cost is \$10 per person; \$2 for children under 2. Spaces fill quickly so early registration is encouraged.




