

## A message from Mayor Weppler

Residents may have learned that a home in Libertyville tested high in lead levels during our last water tests. While this house had high levels, it was the only site showing levels above the federal limits out of 30 homes tested. The majority of the tests showed no lead present and only two others showed any lead in the water. The homes tested are chosen randomly by the Illinois EPA. The health of our residents is important to the Village. We want our residents to understand how lead can enter the water and what actions can be done to correct it. Homes built during or prior to the 1940's could have lead water service lines coming from the Village water main to the home. The service line between the water main to the water shutoff valve is the Village's responsibility. Service lines from the water shutoff valve into the home are the homeowners responsibility. The Village estimates that there are several hundred homes in town where the Village portion of the service line is still comprised of lead. It is most likely that the remaining portion of the service line would be comprised of lead as well. As water mains are replaced, the Village replaces the Village portion of the lead service lines with copper. At that time, we also recommend that homeowners replace the remaining portion of service lines to the home. While there are homes in Libertyville with lead service lines, the Village takes action to prevent those lines from leaching lead into the water. Libertyville's water is obtained through the Central Lake County Joint Action Water Agency (CLCJAWA), the water agency owned by Libertyville and a number of other communities. CLCJAWA adds a chemical called orthophosphate into the water during

## 2016 Village Sticker Sales

Village Stickers are currently on sale at the Village Hall and must be displayed on vehicle windshields no later than May 1. Applications were mailed in March. A vehicle sticker is required for all vehicles registered or housed in the Village. The cost of a sticker is \$30 for cars and trucks. The minimum penalty for not having a valid vehicle sticker displayed is \$100. One hundred percent of vehicle sticker revenue goes to repairing Village streets.

processing. This chemical coats the water lines and prevents lead from leaching into the water.

If you are concerned about your water and would like to have it tested you can pick up a test kit at the Lake County Central Permit Facility located at 500 W. Winchester Road in Libertyville. The charge for the kit and the test is \$25.00. We believe that the home that tested with high lead levels was an isolated incident. However, in the event your water should test above the federally recommended limits our public works staff is able to assist in determining the cause and provide information on how to lower lead levels in your water.

In addition, the Village Board is taking on several projects this summer that our residents might be interested in. Along with the ongoing road rehabilitation this summer, the Village will be constructing a second parking garage in the downtown behind the Libertyville Civic Center. The Board is also looking at architects to renovate the downtown train station. The station work will be paid for from the commuter parking fees.

Neither of these projects will be paid for from property taxes assessed to all residents. Many residents have asked how the construction of the new parking garage will affect our summer events. With the warm weather comes many of Libertyville's fun family events held in the downtown area. MainStreet will also again be sponsoring Out To Lunch, The Farmer's Market and Car Fun on 21.

All of these events will be slightly modified to allow construction of the new parking garage to continue. Also facing changes this year will be the 2017 Libertyville Days. Due to the new parking garage, rides will be located on Cook Avenue as well as Church Street and in Rotary Park. The theme for this year's Libertyville Days Parade is "Pirates of the 'Ville". The parade will begin at 10:00 a.m. on June 18th. ## Smoke Detectors and Carbon Monoxide Detectors

### *What you need to know!*

**W**ith the spring and fall time changes comes an easy reminder to change the batteries in your Smoke Detectors and Carbon Monoxide Detectors. However, this is not the only attention you need to give to these life saving devices. The following are important facts regarding the use and installation of Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors in your home.

#### **Smoke Detectors:**

- Make sure Smoke Detectors are installed in every bedroom, outside sleeping areas, and one on every floor of your home.
- Test your Smoke Detector every month.
- Have a plan when your Smoke Detector sounds to get out, account for everyone and call 911.
- Replace Smoke Detectors every 10 years.

#### **Carbon Monoxide Detectors:**

- Make sure Carbon Monoxide Detectors are installed outside each sleeping area and have at least one on every floor level. The law requires a Carbon Monoxide Detector to be installed within 15 feet of every room used for sleeping purposes.
- Test your Carbon Monoxide Detector every month.
- Contact the Fire Department when your Carbon Monoxide Detector activates, move to fresh air outside and make sure everyone in the home is accounted for.
- Replace Carbon Monoxide Detectors every 10 years.

When purchasing Smoke Detectors or Carbon Monoxide Detectors make sure they have been rated by an approved agency such as Underwriters Laboratory (UL). Homes built within the last 20 years will have hard wired Smoke Detectors located on each floor of the home. When replacing these Smoke Detectors make sure you use a licensed electrician to assure the work is performed according to applicable codes.

## Fats, Oils and Grease (FOG)

On February 11, 2014, the Village of Libertyville Board of Trustees amended the Ordinance on grease traps for all establishments involved in the preparation of food for commercial purposes. Although residential units are not required to have grease traps, here are some topics for handling fats, oils and grease at home. (FOG) are a major contributor of overflows when they build up in the sanitary sewer.



### DO's

- DO** pour fats, oils or grease into a can until they cool. Stored for reuse until full when it can be thrown in the trash.
- DO** wipe pans or dishes that contain FOG with a paper towel before washing and throw in the trash.
- DO** place a strainer in kitchen sink drain to catch food scraps and regularly empty strainer into trash.

### DON'Ts

- DON'T** pour cooking oil, pan drippings, bacon grease, salad dressings or sauces in the sink or toilet.
- DON'T** run water over dishes, pans, fryers or griddles to wash oil and grease down the drain.
- DON'T** use cloth or rags to scrape plates or oily dishware. Washing them causes grease to end up in sewer.

## Lead & Water

The Village purchases its domestic water from the Central Lake County Joint Action Water Agency (CLCJAWA). Water distribution mains then deliver the water throughout the Village. A service line from the mainline then delivers the water to each home and business. The major source of lead in the water supply would be from lead service lines, fixtures and faucets inside the home or business. A lead service can be identified by its dull gray color, can be scratched with a key, and is not magnetic. This is particularly common in, but not exclusive to, structures built before World War II. CLCJAWA adds orthophosphate to their water, which is a certified corrosion inhibitor that coats the inside of pipes and prevents lead from leaching into the water supply.

The Village does test for lead in the water system every three years under the direction of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. The last testing was completed in 2014. As part of this testing program, the Village collected and analyzed 30 representative samples. From the testing in 2014, we had one sample over the Action Limit of 15 parts per billion (ppb). Two other samples had traces of lead, but well below the Action Limit. The other 27 had no traces of lead. The 90 percentile is used for the final results, which was 0.00 ppb for lead in our water supply.

The Village is committed to providing a safe and reliable water supply to all of our customers. If lead service lines from the main to the B-Box (outside shut-off valve) are encountered as part of the Village's annual water main replacement programs, they are replaced with copper and the property owner is encouraged to replace the remaining portion of the service that they are responsible for. The Village's Water Connection Upgrade Fee will also be waived.

If you are interested in testing your water, a lead test kit can be picked up at the Lake County Environmental Laboratory located at the County's Central Permit Facility, 500 W. Winchester Road. The cost of the test kit is \$25.00. Call **(847) 377-8030**. 

## 2016 Road Construction



The Village is getting ready for the 2016 construction season. It will be in the fourth year of the five-year pavement rehabilitation program being completed through the Road Referendum that was passed in March 2012 for the rehabilitation of 30 miles of Village streets. Since the program began, over 18.5 miles of streets have been rehabilitated.

### **Pavement Rehabilitation**

The pavement rehabilitation work involves removal of curbs and gutters, the extent of which varies depending upon the street, as well as pavement patching, removal (grinding) of the pavement surface and placement of new binder and surface (aka "shave and pave"). Work is scheduled through October 1, weather and conditions permitting. Residents will be notified when work begins on their street and if the work will impact access to their driveway. ### **Resurfacing**

In 2016, the Village will be also resurfacing the following streets:

*Greentree Parkway* - Garfield Avenue to Milwaukee Avenue

*Red Top Drive* - Milwaukee Avenue to 4th Avenue

*4th Avenue* - Red Top Drive to Golf Road

The work being done on these streets is the same as the pavement rehabilitation program. However, these streets are being completed with Federal Aid Urban (FAU) Route funding, which is an 80% Federal and 20% Local (Village) share. This project will start in summer 2016. ### **Water Main Replacement**

Prior to the resurfacing work on sections of Johnson Avenue, Wheeler Court, Merrill Court, East Ellis Avenue and West Ellis Avenue, the water main will be replaced. Weather permitting, the water main work is expected to last through mid-June. Water main replacement will include the installation of a new water main and new water services from the main to the shut off in the parkway. ## Stop for Pedestrians in Crosswalks

Changes in State Law regarding pedestrian crossings may still be confusing for motorists and pedestrians. In July of 2010, the State Law changed making it mandatory for all drivers to come to a complete stop for pedestrians in all crosswalks, regardless of whether or not there is a traffic signal or stop sign present at the crosswalk. Previous law only required drivers to yield to pedestrians and stop when necessary. The purpose of the law is to ensure the safety for all road users, including pedestrians and bicyclists.

Libertyville motorists need to pay special attention to the pedestrian crossings without traffic lights or stop signs throughout the Village.

Vehicles must stop for pedestrians within a crosswalk or when a pedestrian is approaching closely enough from the opposite side of the roadway to be in danger.

Pedestrians may not suddenly leave the curb and enter a crosswalk into the path of a moving vehicle that is so close to constitute an immediate hazard.

If any vehicle is stopped at a marked crosswalk at an intersection to permit a pedestrian to cross the road, the driver of any other vehicle approaching from the rear should not pass the stopped vehicle.


