2016 Pavement Rehabilitation

Date: April 22, 2016

Weather permitting, pavement grinding on the streets listed above is scheduled to begin **Wednesday, April 27th**. The contractor expects the work to take 2-3 days. Driveways adjacent to the grinding operations may be temporarily inaccessible while the operations move past.

After grinding, base patching (2-3 days-where necessary) and other preparatory work (2-3 days) is done, the street will be cleaned prior to applying a prime coat (tar-like material). The prime coat allows the resurfacing to bond completely with the original pavement. **Please read the reverse side of this letter for important hints for dealing with road oil.** WATCH FOR "FRESH OIL" SIGNS. These will typically be placed just outside of the construction zone at least 24 hours before the application of road oil.

The Village of Libertyville requests that all vehicles are off the streets listed above from 7am to 5pm.

IMPORTANT SUGGESTIONS FOR DEALING WITH ROAD OIL – PLEASE SAVE!

- Please ask your children to avoid playing in the street after the road oil is applied, and check the bottoms of their shoes before they come into the house.
- Park in garages or in your driveways as far from the street as possible. With windy weather, droplets of spray can be carried several feet.
- If you are driving and see a tank truck or men spraying oil on the street ahead of you, please consider detouring around the area.
- The fresh oil has a wet-looking, dark brown appearance. When the color becomes black with only a slight sheen, the oil has cured. This color change will usually occur within one hour during the hot summer weather, but may take up to 3 hours in cool weather, especially if the pavement is shaded.
- If you must drive through a freshly-oiled area, we strongly recommended that you reduce your speed to 5 to 10 m.p.h. When driving over oil which has cured, we suggest you not exceed 20 m.p.h.
- If you find that your tires have thrown oil onto the sides of your vehicle, any commercially available "bug and tar" remover should safely remove it. It is best to do this cleaning as soon as possible, the material gets more difficult to remove the longer it is left on.

HOW TO OBTAIN CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

A. DIRECT PHONE NOTIFICATION

The Village of Libertyville may be using the Global Connect phone notification system to deliver updates to residents on the road and water main construction this season. IMPORTANT NOTES:

1. If you have a land line telephone in your home or business (or have already enrolled), you will receive these updates without any action required from you.
